












## Simple whale origami

Step	Description	What the children do
1	The teacher gives a short introduction to this hands-on activity. <i>Words: fold, line, angle, backwards, over, back</i>	The children become attentive, and focus on the teacher as storyteller.
2	Explaining the process through show and tell (Attachement)	The children fold the whale by watching the teacher and their neighbour, it is not necessary to give them the worksheet.

# Origami Whale

## You need:

- Construction paper (square)
- Scissors
- Markers or crayons
- (optional: A pipe cleaner or curling ribbon for antennae)

 <p>Fold to central fold</p>	<p>Fold two opposite sides over so that they meet at the fold.</p>	
	<p>Fold the tip over to just meet the other folds.</p>	
	<p>Fold the piece in half along the central axis.</p>	
	<p>Fold the tail up.</p>	
	<p>Make a short cut through the end of the fold in the tail. Fold the edges of the tail outwards.</p>	
	<p>Draw eyes, fins, and any other patterns you like, and enjoy your whale.</p>
